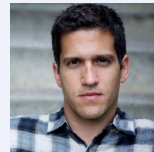

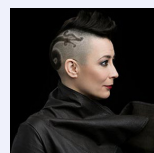
Panio Gianopoulos

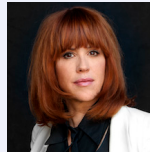
